Donnie Marvin was born in 1935 in Chicago, Illinois and graduated from High School in Vancouver, Washington in 1953. He became a

member of the Oregon National Air Guard in 1953 and was activated due to the Korean War. However, the war ended and his active duty was cancelled after only thirteen days, putting him in the inactive reserves until 1962.

Donnie worked at many jobs through the years such as a powder monkey in the woods of Mount St. Helens, and a warehouse manager for a furniture warehouse, but his love and main occupation has always been playing country music. He started playing the steel guitar in 1948 and has been playing the pedal steel guitar professionally since 1955 when he played with his friend and recording artist Bobby Austin, who wrote and recorded the song Apartment #9. He has played all up and down the West Coast, in seven western states, 2 Canadian provinces, and in the Boise and Southern Idaho area since 1969. He played on numerous television shows in Portland, Seattle, Sacramento, and in Los Angeles on a popular Sunday show called Cal's Corral. When he moved to Boise he played on a TV show called Ida-Ho-Down with a local DJ named Marty Martin, who later became known as Box Car Willie. He has played on stage with many famous artists and in recording sessions on over 400 songs and now has added recording on a CD that is posted on the Internet.

Donnie was sponsored into the Odd Fellows by Frank Markham and initiated into Mountain Home Lodge #19 in March of 1984. He has worn many hats for the lodge, including secretary for over 15 years, janitor and building manager and received the Merit Jewel from his lodge in May of 2004. He joined the Encampment in 1994 and the Patriarchs Militant in 1994. He became Grand Patriarch of the Grand Encampment in 2002, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge in 2005, and has achieved the rank of Colonel with the Department Council Patriarchs Militant. In 2006 and 2007 he was one of the Representatives for the Grand Lodge to Sovereign Grand Lodge.








Henry Ford begins tinkering with the gas engine for a self propelled vehicle when Jim was a teenager. The State of Idaho had recently joined the Union 17 years earlier in 1890.

After graduating from high school, he attended the College of Idaho in Caldwell where he earned a bachelor degree. Later, he enrolled in the University of Idaho in Moscow and earned a masters degree. He taught at various schools throughout the Treasure Valley. He also worked for the U.S. Post Office for many years and later years was employed by the State of Idaho in the postal service.

Jim is fond of saying that he traveled to Ireland and kissed the Blarney Stone for good luck and for the excitement of the moment!

He joined the Odd Fellow Lodge in Boise on September 23, 1963. Jim has held many appointed and elected offices throughout the years in both the Rebekah and Odd Fellow Lodges in Boise.
