Being a Rebekah means that when you are asked to do something, you do it! I need to apologize because I really have not been much of a membership chairman.

The membership in our order is declining, everyone knows that. We've all heard the suggestions on how to approach someone about becoming a member, in fact I would guess that we have probably all visited with ladies and gentleman that would make great Rebekah's and did not even think about talking about being a Rebekah and what it has meant to you, I know I have.

When I was a Theta Rho girl, just a few years ago, becoming a Rebekah was a natural choice, but even then, gaining members was difficult. This was a time when most woman no longer had the luxury of being able to be stay at home wives and mom's, most had full time job's and did the juggling act of work, home and family. Being gone on a weeknight was a difficult choice to make. I made the choice because I lived in Troy, so getting to go to Deary every other week to spend time with friends was a joy to me. My husband did not care much for it, at that time men were not Rebekah's and the Odd Fellow's no longer had a club in Deary, or Troy. Times have really not changed much.

Over the years, I've made as many meeting as I could, I've gone through the chair's as Noble Grand more times that I can remember and made more Assemblies than I can remember too, but I do know that I've gotten to see parts of Idaho that I might not ever have gotten to had I not been a Rebekah and made friends across the state that I love seeing every year.

I recall a conversation with a Rebekah sister a few years back, she was frustrated, and was considering leaving the order. We visited a while but I remember her asking me why I had become a Rebekah and what made me stay a Rebekah for so many years. I think my first response was, "Well, mom makes me!" and then I laughed. At the District #5 Meeting held on March 14th, a 25 year jewel was awarded to Donnie Marvin by Clyde Davis. Here is the speech that Clyde Davis gave for the ceremony.

"Today, it is my privilege and honor to award a twenty five year Veterans Jewel to an Odd Fellow who, in my opinion, has been overlooked, to some degree, in the dedication and continuous support he has given to all aspects of Odd Fellowship. Since he signed the Members Register, twenty five years ago, he as served as Noble Grand and Secretary of his lodge for a number of years. He has also, on more than one occasion served as District Deputy Grand Master. He has never refused a request to serve on a committee or as an Appointive Officer in his home lodge or the Grand Lodge. In 2005-2006 he served as the Grand Master of the Jurisdiction of Idaho. He also found time to serve other units of the Order, such as Grand Patriarch of the Grand Encampment of Idaho in 2002-2003, and is currently, the Grand Scribe of the Grand Encampment of Idaho. And while serving as Grand Scribe, he took over as Representative to Sovereign Grand Lodge for Earl Graham when he passed away, and continued as a Representative to SGL for two additional years, and then took on the additional office of Department Commander of the Department Council, Patriarchs Militant of Idaho for 2007-2009. During this time of serving Odd Fellowship, he also had to have back surgery and a hip replacement. Past Grand Master, Past Grand Patriarch, Department commander Donnie Marvin of Mountain Home Lodge #19, please rise and come to the center of the floor where it will be my pleasure to present you with a well earned Veterans Jewel."

The idea for creating a day for children to honor their fathers began in Spokane, Washington. A woman by the name of Sonora Smart Dodd thought of the idea for Father's Day while listening to a Mother's Day sermon in 1909.

Having been raised by her father, William Jackson Smart, after her mother died, Sonora wanted her father to know how special he was to her. It was her father that made all the parental sacrifices and was, in the eyes of his daughter, a courageous, selfless, and loving man. Sonora's father was born in June, so she chose to hold the first Father's Day celebration in Spokane, Washington on the 19th of June, 1910.

In 1926, a National Father's Day Committee was formed in New York City. Father's Day was recognized by a Joint Resolution of Congress in 1956. In 1972, President Richard Nixon established a permanent national observance of Father's Day to be held on the third Sunday of June. So Father's Day was born in memory and gratitude by a daughter who thought that her father and all good fathers should be honored with a special day just like we honor our mothers on Mother's Day.

"OLD GLORY!"

This famous name was coined by Captain William Driver, a shipmaster of Salem, Massachusetts, in 1831. As he was leaving on one of his many voyages aboard the brig CHARLES DOGGETT - and this one would climax with the rescue of the mutineers of the BOUNTY - some friends presented him with a beautiful flag of twenty four stars. As the banner opened to the ocean breeze for the first time, he exclaimed "Old Glory!"

He retired to Nashville in 1837, taking his treasured flag from his sea days with him. By the time the Civil War erupted, most everyone in and around Nashville recognized Captain Driver's "Old Glory." When Tennesee seceded from the Union, Rebels were determined to destroy his flag, but repeated searches revealed no trace of the hated banner.

Then on February 25th, 1862, Union forces captured Nashville and raised the American flag over the capital. It was a rather small ensign and immediately folks began asking Captain Driver if "Old Glory" still existed. Happy to have soldiers with him this time, Captain Driver went home and began ripping at the seams of his bedcover. As the stitches holding the quilt-top to the batting unraveled, the onlookers peered inside and saw the 24-starred original "Old Glory"!

Captain Driver gently gathered up the flag and returned with the soldiers to the capitol. Though he was sixty years old, the Captain climbed up to the tower to replace the smaller banner with his beloved flag. The Sixth Ohio Regiment cheered and saluted - and later adopted the nickname "Old Glory" as their own, telling and re-telling the story of Captain Driver's devotion to the flag we honor yet today.

Captain Driver's grave is located in the old Nashville City Cemetery, and is one of three (3) places authorized by act of Congress where the Flag of the United States may be flown 24 hours a day.
