



## GLADYS HENSLEY

1917 ~ 2010

### PAST PRESIDENT REBEKAH ASSEMBLY

Gladys L. Hensley, 92, passed away June 30, 2010, at Mount Vernon Assisted Living Center in Idaho Falls, Idaho.

She was born Dec. 7, 1917, in Dubois, Idaho, to Max E. Hohman and Cora Bessinger. She attended school in Rigby and Dubois, graduating from Dubois High School in 1935. She later graduated from Kinsman Business College.

She married Clarence Hensley in 1942; he passed away in 1961. She later married Floyd Hensley in 1964.

She worked for the U.S. Experiment Station for 30 years as a statistical clerk, retiring in 1974. She then worked in the family businesses, A-1 Automatic Transmission and Floyd's Transmission Parts for the next 20 years. After retiring the second time, Gladys enjoyed traveling, spending winters in Arizona, gardening and spending time in Island Park with family and friends. She was very active with the Rebekahs and Eastern Star.

Gladys joined the Rebekahs in Dubois, Idaho, in 1967. In 1987 Poinsettia #115 consolidated with Lily #33 in Idaho Falls, making her a 53-year member of the Rebekah Lodge. She was Assembly President in 1976~1977. Gladys was talented at preparing ceremonies, her last ceremony was presented at Assembly in 2009. Chaperoning a bus load of students on the IOOF United Nations tour in 1964, was a great joy to her. Gladys and Anna Breeze, P.P., composed, for statewide distribution, the "Book of Instructions", which we all have and use. Gladys prepared her famous sour dough pancake batter for 200 people at the "Fish Fry" and received a plaque for the Encampment for cooking for 25 years. She often said, "the lodge has been our life".

Gladys was a lifetime member of Eastern Star and VFW #2146 Auxiliary. She was also a member of the American Legion Auxiliary for 57 years.


She was always willing to try new activities, from going on 4-wheeler rides to going for a ride on the back of a motorcycle at the age of 90. She was an excellent cook and took pride in preparing meals for her family, especially her sourdough pancakes and rolls. Her greatest joy was her family.

Floyd and Gladys' son, Earl, gave her a beautiful, loving tribute at her funeral. Telling of all she had done for him and discussing her tolerance for 21 bum lambs in the basement needing nurturing and shooing a bear out of the camper with a broom. He talked, touchingly, of her never failing love for him and his devotion to her and her love for his wife, Debbie, and their family.






Dear Brothers and Sisters,



## BRIEF HISTORY OF ANNA REBEKAH LODGE #14

It has been 120 years since Anna #14 was instituted on May 5, 1890. 8 men and 5 women signed the Charter.

Its initiation dues and fees were one dollar each. The meetings were held, as they still are, the first and third Wednesdays.

Out of town members came by horse back or team and buggy.

The Sisters thought they needed a mirror, comb and brush, to be used by everyone. The same mirror is used today.

We also still have the robes, well, jar and tambourine, used in initiation ceremonies.

In June 1898, 6 chairs were made for the sum of \$7.40, still in use.

There were 50 members at that time. It would be nice if we had that many members now.

The Rebekahs have been in the present hall since August 1909.

It was in 1928, when Sister Jessie Goodall was elected Warden of the Rebekah Assembly, and yours truly, was honored to represent Anna #14 as the R.A. President in 2007-2008.

## NEW BOOK ON ODD FELLOWSHIP

A German university student recently published a new book on the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. The 166 page book was completed after a great deal of research by Stephanie Muller, an university student on Germany. The Volume (2008) is a scientific work in the field of cultural studies. The publisher is Heartland of America, part of the German publishing company WVT.

Up until now, the "three links" symbol of the International Independent Order of Odd Fellows can be found on the buildings of schools, community canters and churches throughout the United States. But what do they represent, what does this ancient Order stand for?

This work provides an overview of the Order's history from its very beginnings until today. It explains its organizational structure and gives a comprehensive insight into its concept and contents, its symbols and ceremonies. In addition, it discusses the role famous Odd Fellows, such as U.S. presidents and politicians played in society. Finally, information on the Order's current situation and its future perspectives is provided.

This work is one of the few recent documents written about Odd Fellows in the United States. It can serve as an accessible overview for readers interested in the Order's nature and is at the same time a well-documented source of profound knowledge of the Odd Fellows. The book can be obtained off the internet and it is priced at €22.00 or \$29.00. To purchase a copy or to obtain additional information go to <http://www.americanheartland.com/index.php?cat=PROMOTION&product=VOLUME%2010>. The book is divided into 8 sections starting with an introduction, "History of Odd Fellows", "Organizational Structure of the Order", "Concept and Contents of Odd Fellowship", "Famous Odd Fellows and their Work", "The Odd Fellows Now and in the Future", "Bibliography" and "An Appendix". A complete table of contents and some main features that distinguish the publication from others is, a) comprehensive summary of the most important historic events, b) a section on famous Odd Fellows and c) an analysis of the current situation and future perspectives.






