In Memoriam

Frank Lawyer, PGC 1933-2013

Grand Patriarch, 1989 Dept. Commander, 1996 Grand Master, 1998 General Commanding, 2000



Franklin E. Layer of Idaho Falls, Idaho passed away on July 9th, 2013 at the age of 79. He was born on August 12th, 1933 in Normal, Illinois, to Elmer and Josephine Shomacher Lawyer. Frank married Elizabeth (Betty) Rankin in 1954. In 1967 Frank and Betty moved to Idaho in search of employment. They enjoyed 53 years of marriage until Betty's death in 2008, during which time they raised two children, Brian and Julie.

At the time of his death, Frank was a member of the Odd Fellows for 45 years but was most notably proud of his 32 years service in the Rebekah Lodge. He joined Bingham Lodge in Idaho Falls in 1977 by reinstatement after having been a member in Illinois for approximately 9 years. Brother Frank was a significant contributor in many ways to his home Lodge and the Order as a whole and was always an actively participant in his Lodge activities though he seemed to work mostly in the background. In addition to being very active in the Order, Frank was always active in the community. For several years Frank made "mountain man" presentations in full mountain man dress at several grade schools in the Idaho Falls area and was Regional Director of the Citizens Against Poaching organization for 25 years.

Frank was a man who lived his life living and breathing the brotherhood of man and the fatherhood of God. It was in 2012, after living with a serious medical condition involving an aneurism for several years he was able to finally have the condition repaired. However, during the subsequent recovery period he suffered a condition causing kidney failure and his once robust health began to deteriorate from which he was never able to fully recover. At the time of his death Brother Frank was a mainstay of his Lodge and will be missed tremendously.

Remember, you have representatives going to Sovereign Grand Lodge on your behalf, so let them know what you would like to see done and then support them. Read your Journals, which are available to each lodge (you can also purchase them individually from the Grand Lodge) and talk with your representatives to Grand Lodge for information.

I will repeat what was published before about the maintenance of the lodge buildings with a word of caution. Please read what is taking place so you are not disappointed or misinformed on what the program is about. It is to help those that <u>need</u> it to bring their lodges up to a presentable building site and in that way bolster or increase the membership. There are limited funds available, so it is fairly strict for acceptance.

The Lodge Assistance Program has been completed as far as the Application Form and the procedure is concerned. Each lodge seeking assistance is to <u>write a request</u> to the Grand Lodge for the proper form and <u>follow the instructions</u> that will be included in a returned cover letter and application.



Committee Chairpersons, have you had a meeting? Do you even know who is on your committee? Have you checked the Directory for this information? Have you let the Executive Committee know what is needed or what ideas are forthcoming? If none of this is happening, then ask yourself, what good is that committee??

417 Jefferson street, Boise. Idaho. October 25th.1950.

To the Officers and Members of Ada Lodge no 3,1.0.0.F

A Little History of Odd Fellowship in Idaho

During this year and next year the 150th Celebration Committee of Pioneer Lodge #1 will be putting articles and letters of the history of Odd Fellowship in Idaho, in the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs News, to get you ready for a great Celebration on July 12, 2014. One of the most memorable writers during the depression who wrote about hope for our order was Presley F. Horne, Past Grand Secretary; many of the articles will be from his stories and correspondences. We also hope for you to share some of the history you or your family has witnessed, that you think should be part of the collection. We hope you enjoy this Beautiful story; it brought a tear to our eyes when we read it and we hope it will to yours.

Taking Up a Charter

Soon after I became Grand Secretary I set out for Van Wyck to take up the Charter of Peerless Lodge No. 74. The lodge had not reported for nearly five years, and the new Grand Secretary was full of youthful enthusiasm and a determination to wipe all dead lodges off the slate. It was an all-day ride on the train to Cascade, the nearest railroad point, and early the next morning I followed a muddy trail over the hill to the nearly deserted pioneer town of Van Wyck. The lodge building was still there, but its only occupants were pack rats, and it was most evident that no meetings were being held. I wandered up and down the street but could not find an Odd Fellow. Finally a small boy told me the postmistress was looking for me, and when I arrived at the post office I found Sister Goldie Lash, apparently the only member of the Order living in town. She had learned that I carried a commission from the Grand Master authorizing me to take up the Charter of this lodge, and she wasted no time to bringing up the subject. Abruptly she asked me if the Charter was to be recalled, and when I told her that my investigation seemed to justify such a course, she pointed her finger in schoolteacher fashion and said:

"Young man, let me tell you a few things you don't know about Odd Fellowship in Van Wyck. You think because this lodge does not hold regular meetings that there is no Odd Fellowship here, but I want you to know there is." Pointing to the open door of an adjoining room she continued, "In that room last winter my husband was confined to his bed for months with an illness from which he could not recover. It is true the Odd Fellows do not meet regularly in their lodge room, but not a day passed without one or more of them coming to see George and sitting for a few minutes by his bedside. Finally it became necessary for someone to be in constant attendance, and these Odd Fellows took turns in helping us through those long nights. And then the night came which was to be George's last on earth. Two brothers were here that night, one seated on each side of the bed. George was unconscious most of the night, but along about four in the morning his eyes opened, he smiled, and spoke faintly, for his strength was rapidly going, and then occurred the thing which I shall never forget. Those two Odd Fellows reached their hands across the bed, clasping them over George's hand, and one of them said, 'George, we realize that you will not be with us much longer, and of course you know it too, so we want to promise you before you go that as long as we live your wife will not want for anything.' A few minutes later George passed away with a smile on his lips because of the promise made to him by these brothers. The next day the Odd Fellows broke a trail through five feet of snow up to the old cemetery, and there under the pines George was laid to rest. Perhaps no ritual had been opened in the lodge room for several years, but these faithful brothers conducted the regular funeral service of Odd Fellowship for their departed member, and George was given the kind of funeral service he had desired."

There were tears in Mrs. Lash's eyes as she finished her story, and there were tears in my eyes, too and she concluded the interview by saying, "Don't tell me that Odd Fellowship in Van Wyck is dead, for I know better."

Thus from this Sister of the Rebekah Degree I learned another lesson in Odd Fellowship: that fraternity is not measured by the number of lodge meetings held in a year, but by the way we render assistance to those in need; that fraternity, unless embodied in acts of humanity, is but an empty name.

Was the Charter of Peerless Lodge taken up? Of course not, because the spirit of Odd Fellowship still lived in Van Wyck, and even though the fire of lodge activity was burning low, I knew it would blaze again, and IT DID. The old lodge was moved to the neighboring town of Cascade, and in due time lodge activities were renewed. Today Peerless Lodge No. 74 meets regularly in its own lodge building and has a good membership of earnest Odd Fellows. I wonder if any of them know that a Rebekah once saved their Charter?
