Caldwell Lodge Instituted In 1884 With 10 Members



Caldwell Lodge #10 was instituted May 21, 1884, the first lodge to be instituted usder the Jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Idaho, with Brothers Montie Gwinn, George Little and C.O. Picard as charter members.

On that date 10 candidates were initiated and given the three degrees which were conferred by the Grand Lodge officers from Ada Lodge No. 3.

For the first four years the lodge meetings were held in rented quarters. Then in 1887 they built their own building at the corner of 7th and Main Street. They occupied this building until February 7th, 1923 when the present building, one of the outstanding lodge buildings in Idaho, was completed. The cornerstone for this building was laid September 28, 1922.

The building was constructed at a cost of \$55,500.00. \$28,100.00 was derived from the sale of their first building, donations and from the general funds of the lodge. Bonds in the amount of \$27,000.00 were issued. Many of these were purchased by members of the lodge. The last of these bonds were retired in 1945.

Brother J.O. Andres was noble grand when the building was dedicated, February 9, 1923.

In 1956 sux rental offices were constructed on the east side of the building facing Kimball Avenue. Caldwell Lodge No. 10 celebrated the burning of this mortgage March 20, 1964.

Caldwell Lodge No. 10 is unique in that meetings have been held every Wednesday evening since its inception, May 21, 1884. This amounts to 4,786 meetings as of June 10, 1976.
