A few things about me, and some of my experiences. On November 9, 1954 I was born in Bakersfield, California. My father was an auto mechanic / farmer. When I was five we moved to Nampa Idaho, where my parents bought a five acre farm. We raised goats for a time, but when we had to keep building the fences higher and higher to keep the goats in, my father sold the goats and bought a cow. At the age of 8, my family included four older sisters, two older brothers and one younger brother that I got to boss around. We invested in a 40 acre farm and more cows in the Kuna area. When we finally sold that farm we had grown to 120 cows to milk and 80 acres to farm.

My parents and grandparents were very active in the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs. My







My grandfather was a long time member. Every meeting night it was expected to attend in formal dresses and suits. As kids we used to sing at the Lodge Christmas party in Nampa. Even though my family history with the Orders date back to the 1800's, I was like so many other family members that didn't connect with the Order until later. Life, family, jobs, and moving always seemed to get it the way, but I finally made it into the Order.

In 1973 I graduated from Kuna High. I went on to study music at the University of Idaho, where I met my beautiful wife Connie who is my rock, my support and my caregiver. We married on August 10, 1974, and have three wonderful kids, Joshua, Jeremy and Melissa. Between them we have 4 grand daughters and one grandson.

Connie and I both worked for Hewlett Packard for over 20 years. I started in Boise, transferred to the Spokane Division for 8 years, transferred back to Boise for another 8 years, and then transferred to the Vancouver Division in Washington. After I left HP I worked for the Laidlaw School Bus Company, where I worked for 6 years as Division Manager at the Tigard Oregon Division. We were then transferred to Grand Junction Colorado. After 10 years in Colorado, we wanted to get back to Boise, Idaho. We moved back here in 2010.

After moving back to Boise, I battled throat cancer for two years. My voice may not always work, but thank God I am alive and currently cancer free! At that time I became involved with Division of Elections and met David Smith the Chief Judge and also a member of Ada #3 IOOF. We talked about the Odd Fellows and I soon joined the brotherhood.

After getting my 1st degree in Boise, and my 2nd and 3rd degrees in Nampa, I became more interested in the Order. I spent time visiting other Lodges and seeing how they performed. I joined Nampa # 40, Caldwell #10, and the Historical Pioneer #1 lodge in Idaho City as an associate member.

Each Lodge does a few things differently, but the fellowship is what I found so very enjoyable. In Loving Memory







Laura Maye Englehart passed away on June 20, 2018 in Nampa, Idaho. She was born on August 7, 1922 to Hugh and Rhoma (Coffin) Hansberry in Cortez, Colorado. She spent her younger years on the farm near Cortez and moved with her family to Weiser, Idaho in 1935.

She graduated from Weiser High School in 1940 and shortly thereafter went to work for the Prudential Insurance Company in Seattle. In 1944 she transferred with the insurance company to San

Francisco and on June 11, 1945 she married John Englehart in Reno, Nevada. John was in the U.S. Navy and had served in both the Atlantic and Pacific theaters of World War II. He had just been assigned to the Navy Department, so the couple made their first home in Washington D.C. While there their first daughter (Leslie) was born at the Naval Hospital in Bethesda, Maryland.

Following John's tour of duty with the Navy, the family moved back to Weiser where their second daughter (Barbara) was born. In 1957 the family moved to Caldwell, Idaho. In 1962 Laura went to work for the CPA firm of Jackson, Messuri & Company where she worked for 22 years, retiring in 1984. In 1977 John went to work for the Association of Idaho Cities in Boise and John and Laura moved to Middleton. In 1988 they moved to Silvercrest Estates where she resided for the rest of her life.

Following their retirement the couple spent their winters in Southern California and Arizona (a total of 27 for Laura) and their summers enjoying their RV and many activities with family and friends in Idaho. They made many lifelong friends, played lots of golf and thoroughly enjoyed their retirement.

John passed away in 1999 and Laura continued, with her little dog Yuki, to spend her winters in Arizona for another 14 years. In 2013, at the age of 91, she announced that would be her last winter in Arizona. She continued to live independently in her Nampa home enjoying a variety of interests. She passed her driver's license test in 2017 and was still driving her one owner 1996 Chevy Lumina two weeks prior to her passing. She was a proud, active and enthusiastic member of the Rebekah Lodge for 68 years. In 1982 she served as President of the Rebekah Assembly of Idaho and during her term as Idaho's president she visited all 80 of the state's Rebekah Lodges. She was a recipient of the Odd Fellows' Merit Jewel and the Decoration of Chivalry.
