Idaho Odd Fellow/Rebekah News

Miss your paper last month? Sorry it was not printed. The News Paper Board met the end of February, after the March issue had been printed. We made the decision to not print the paper for April, due to the amount of funds we collect from dues, does not cover the cost of printing 12 issues. We purchased a printer to reduce the cost of printing, which it has done, and we are saving \$121.33 per issues or \$1,456.00 per year. However, it still cost \$5,777.00 a year to produce the paper and we only collect \$3,438.00 from dues from all members. We do collect money each year from donations, but that money is not guaranteed. The board also elected to cancel printing for June and July, but will print August and September prior to our Grand Sessions in Moscow. At that time, we will ask the Grand Bodies what they would like to do. Such as go to all digital, print quarterly, bi-monthly, raise the subscription rate or close out the newspaper all together. Talk to your representatives and let them know what your lodge wants to do. We could even e-mail the paper and each lodge prints out a copy for the members to read. It's up to you.

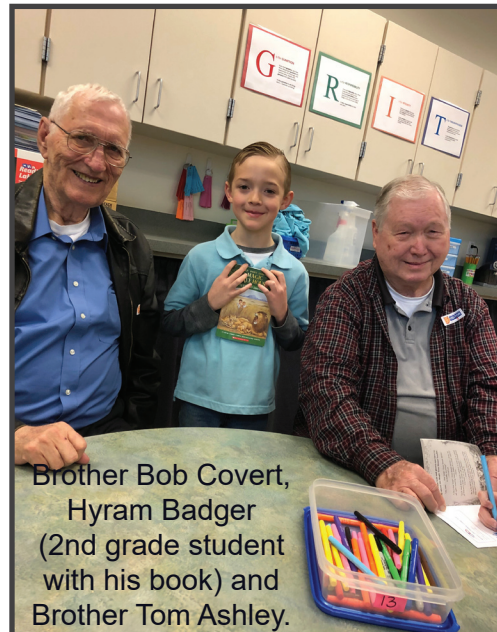

AFTER 92 YEARS UNMARKED GRAVE OF REMARKABLE BOISE WOMAN WILL HAVE HEADSTONE

This is an excerpt from the Idaho Statesman article on Corilla Robbins

Boise pioneer Corilla Robbins led a remarkable life. She crossed the plains from Missouri to Idaho, leading a team of prairie schooners with her husband and four children in 1876. She rode to Idaho City in Boise's first horse-drawn taxi.

In 1903, when the first automobile arrived in Boise, a roadster, she was the first woman to take a ride. When the first airplane arrived in 1919, naturally Robbins, then 73, was among the first to jump aboard the bi-plane and fly over Boise. "That was some ride," Robbins told the Idaho Statesman after the flight. "Believe me, I wouldn't have missed it for anything."



What Robbins didn't get when she died in 1927 at age 81 was a headstone. For 92 years, her grave in Pioneer Cemetery on Warm Springs Avenue has remained unmarked. Her husband Rube Robbins erected a 10 foot high pedestal that marks his grave, but left nothing for her.

Corilla was a prominent on her own and deserves recognition. She led the suffrage movement in Idaho, She toured Idaho establishing Rebekah lodges. She also cared for orphaned children in her home on Warm Spring Avenue, At age 79 Robbins was arrested for operating a maternity ("lying in") hospital in her home without a license. A jury found her guilty. She was fined \$50, equivalent to \$722 today. The conviction was overturned on appeal."

Doing a little research on my own, I found that Corilla Robbins was the third Rebekah Assembly President in the State of Idaho in 1895, and she was from Unity #8 in Boise.

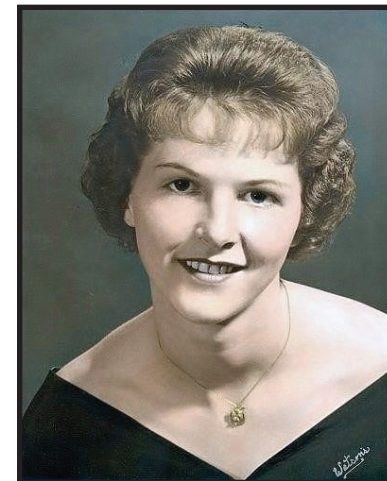

White Bird, Idaho - Our Sister, Rhea Smurthwaite Weems Kroencke, 75, died peacefully in her sleep on Feb. 22, 2019, due to complications following surgery. Rhea was born on Nov. 24, 1943 in Cottonwood, Idaho, to parents William "Bill" and Lena Taylor Smurthwaite of White Bird. She worked at many different occupations during her life, and while working for Heckman Cattle Company in 1966, she met and married her best friend Johann "John" Kroencke. They were blessed with 47 years of marriage and 5 children before John passed away in 2014 due to cancer.

Rhea's service was at the White Bird Cemetery on March 1, 2019, with Sister Tammy Stone officiating. It was lovely, and included music that Rhea had requested. During the service, we Rebekahs honored our dear departed sister with a memorial speech and prayer, and then we each laid a flower on the bier for Sister Rhea.

Sister Rhea joined the Royal Gem Rebekah Lodge in White Bird in 1962. Though she was away for many years, she maintained her membership with us. When she and John returned to White Bird, she became an active member, fulfilling the office of Noble Grand twice. Rhea was a Sister Rebekah for 57 years.

To be a Rebekah signifies a desire to contribute to a kinder world through volunteerism and example. Sister Rhea was always ready to volunteer, whether by cooking, sewing, fundraisers, planning floats and many other projects. While Noble Grand, Rhea was instrumental in placing the beautiful Veteran's Memorial Monument in our City Park.

The service was followed by a well-attended community dinner for family and friends at the IOOF Hall. Food was provided by the Sisters and the community.
