

On December 22, 2022, Challis Daughter, Lillian Black/MacFee, will celebrate her 100th Birthday.

Born in Challis in a small cabin on the river just south of town, Lillian was the first daughter of Ralph and Lilly Black who worked as farm hands and mining in the area. She spent the first decade of her life playing with her brothers, Junior and Dick, on the Salmon River and farm fields of the old Oster Farm at Holman and Thompson Creeks.

Then came the great depression. After eighth grade, Lillian, had to quit school and help the family by working in the Clayton Hotel. The depression also brought to Idaho...the CCC boys. One good looking and feisty Scotsman from New York caught her eye... and she and Scotty MacFee were married in 1939

down in Hailey. Like her parents, Lillian and Scotty worked the fields and Forest Lookouts in summer and in the mines during the winter.

Lillian and Scotty were finally able to buy a place of their own on the Salmon River at the mouth of Squaw Cr. They also bought and operated a store in Clayton for several years. In the cold winter mornings Lillian would open the store while Scotty drove the local school children to Challis. In 1953, Lillian joined and started her lifelong relationship with the Rebekahs.

In 1956 the Atomic Age was born, and Lillian and Scotty sold the store and moved to Blackfoot... for a job at the AEC for Scotty and School District for Lillian. They kept the property at Squaw Cr. and the family members continued to live there and/or in Challis for several decades.

Retiring in 1980, they left Blackfoot and moved to Wendell to care for her mother Lilly Black, continue their memberships in the Rebekahs, Odd Fellows, Grange and became official 'Snowbirds', wintering in Quartzsite, AZ.

Scotty left us in 2006 and Lillian now lives in Boise near family in a retirement facility called Salmon Cr. along with a few friends from the Challis area too. One of Lillian's proudest life-accomplishments has been... being a member of the Rebekahs for nearly 70 years and making so many friends through the organization.

The picture of Lillian shows her cooking chicken for family dinner at her daughter's river property...which happens to be on the old Oster Farm...the same fields she and her brothers roamed as children. Funny where life takes us...and back again.
