Mary Bishop Celebrates 100 Years



100 years ago on January 25th Mary Bishop joined the family of Elmer and Maie Himes and their five children in Quinter, Kansas. Church, family, hard work and fun were the cornerstones of this loving family and set the tone for Mary's life. Three younger siblings arrived after Mary completing the family. Mary's close family had yearly gatherings where great food, laughter, cards and support for each other were treasured.

When Mary was 10, during the Dust Bowl, the family moved to Emmett, Idaho where the family worked in the fruit orchards. While in high school, she met Harold Bishop (a wayward spit wad) and a lifelong love began. After graduation Mary worked as a telephone operator, and

when World War two started, Harold joined the Marines and was stationed in Bremerton Washington. After daily letters were exchanged, Mary Joined Harold and became a war bride and son Dennis joined the family. When Harold was shipped to the South Pacific, Mary returned to Emmett with memories of rationing, waiting for letters/news, and after David was born, two babies to care for.

When the war ended the family moved to Stibnite, Idaho where Harold worked in the mines and Janie was born. The next stop was New Meadows; Harold started logging and Linden and Kathleen, (who died as an infant), joined the family. Then came Kooskia, the final move, and son Rocky was born. Harold and Mary purchased their home/ranch of 67 years where Mary lives today. Mary worked hard all her life: raised five children (Rocky through polio), milked cows, raised a huge garden with fruit trees, canned, hayed, drove tractor, managed the farm while dad worked as a logger etc. Perhaps the job she treasurers most is her 20 years as a school bus driver.

Mary was also a master participating in quilt club activities. She also enjoyed church, playing cards, traveling and spending time with her children, 19 grandchildren and 32 greats. Mary has been a member of Sylvan Rebekah Lodge in Clearwater for 60 plus years. Lodge was/ is an important part of her life. She held different offices but ended up as secretary for many years.

Her 100th birthday celebration, planned by her grandchildren, was held on January 28th at the Clearwater IOOF Hall.


